The golf team began the season with canceled meets due to poor weather conditions. Members of the golf team include Ryker Warrington, Aiden Abraham, Jackson Wadsworth, Carson Stormo, Jacob Williams, Eva Koisti, and Ally Abraham. Athletes have been able to place at every meet. Aiden Abraham earned first place at the GPL meet on the Cattail Crossing Course. At the Florence-Henry Invitational at the Prairie Winds course on May 11, Eva Koisti placed second, Ally Abraham placed eighth, and Aiden Abraham placed ninth. The region meet will be held on May 22, and the state tournament is June 5 and 6.

The track team has on average have been attending two meets per week. Gracelyn Leiseth holds the all-time state record among all three classes and school record in discus (175'3"). The school record in shot put 52' 6.75" Zac VanMeeteren broke the school record in the 100 (11.10) and 200 (22.65). Kami Wadsworth holds the javelin record at 128'11".
